The England Boxing National Youth Development Championships 2024 are contested in accordance with the Rules, Directives, Policies and Procedures issued by England Boxing and available [here](#). England Boxing reserves the right to amend, alter, or to add Rules, Directives, Policies and Procedures at any time it deems necessary. Clubs will be notified of these changes via the Vault and England Boxing Website.

1. Introduction - The England Boxing National Youth Development Championships 2024 is open to Boxers born in 2006-2007. All bouts will be boxed over 3 x 2 minute rounds.

2. Previous Combat Experience - All previous combat experience **MUST** be declared with England Boxing, and Updated on The Locker so it will show on a Boxer's Digital BCR1 and outlined on this entry form. Any Boxer / Coach who makes a false previous combat declaration **WILL** be removed from the Championships, and the matter reported to England Boxing's Compliance Team where sanctions may be taken against the Boxer, Coach and / or Club.

3. Previous Combat Experience Complaint Procedure - Any Club wishing to raise a formal complaint to England Boxing with regards to an opponent's alleged previous combat experience must have gathered sufficient evidence for this complaint to be dealt with. All evidence must be sent to EBChampionships@englandboxing.org in accordance with the Championship Entry Infringement Protocols (page 87 – 89 of the 2023/2024 England Boxing Rulebook). Any claim lacking evidence will be dismissed as vexatious. The Championships Coordinator, with the Sub-Committee, will decide the next steps and inform affected Boxers/Clubs.

4. Eligibility - Youth entrants will require to have the following:

Males: minimum of 2 bouts and maximum of 14 bouts upon entry and Females: minimum of 2 bouts and maximum of 10 bouts on entry. (ALL Skills bouts will be counted as 0.5 of an EB bout.)

Please Note: As of 2024 - You cannot enter the Development Championships if you have **Won the Open Youth Championships** in the Same Calendar Year.

5. Affiliation - Boxers may only enter through one Regional Association and **MUST** be registered to an England Boxing-affiliated club. All Coaches are to have a current England Boxing coaching lanyard with all pre-requisite qualifications in date and are to produce it when requested.

6. Medical Entry Criteria - The Boxer's medical (rolling 12 month duration) must cover any bout and be Uploaded on The Locker. The Boxer's Digital BCR1 must be produced at the initial weigh-in and at all subsequent rounds. Boxers cannot be considered registered for the Championships until their weight and digital BCR1 have been verified by the Regional Officials' Representative.

7. Entry Form - All entry forms must be filled in accurately and honestly. Entry forms must be printed then signed by boxer, parent/legal guardian, and club secretary. An entry fee (Regionally determined) must accompany each application when sent to the Regional Secretary. **The Regional Secretary is required to send a list of all Female entries to the Championship Co-ordinator by the 22nd September 2024 and all Male entries by 29th September 2024.** Failure to do so will result in the Region being withdrawn from the Championships. The list is to have the Regional representatives for each weight category and must be complete by this date regardless of

whether a Region has a bye at this stage.

8. Weigh-in - All Boxers must Weigh In dressed in Shorts and Vest or Singlet. Boxers may transfer weight categories up until the initial weigh-in or regional deadline, whichever is earlier. The Boxer's weight recorded by the Supervisor at the initial weigh-in or regional deadline will determine the category of the Boxer. Please note that if a Region opts to use the regional deadline they must not also use initial weigh in as part of the entry process and vice versa. During the weigh-in period, Boxers may have as many check weighs as required, however, Boxers are only allowed to lose a maximum weight of;

A Boxer will not be allowed to change weight category after the initial weigh-in/regional deadline unless no other boxer has entered across the country in that weight category. This move can only be sanctioned by the Championships Co-ordinator, who will be responsible for informing all affected Boxers/Clubs. Boxers will not be able to change weight category if they have already boxed in this Championships at another weight.

9. Weight Allowance - There will be **no weight allowance** in this Championships.

10. Photography - When you participate in an England Boxing event, you may be filmed or photographed at any point during your participation. By becoming an Individual Member of England Boxing, you grant permission to identify you by name in video footage/photographs and to use the resulting video footage/photographs for promotional and commercial purposes, including the streaming of England Boxing's national Competitions, irrespective of whether you remain an Individual Member of England Boxing. England Boxing will not be required to pay you for the use of such videos/images, the copyright in which will be owned by England Boxing. If you do not consent to being filmed or photographed, please inform England Boxing in writing,

11. Doping Control – Participants may be subjected to doping control testing at the event. All entrants and supporting personnel shall be deemed to have made themselves familiar with and agreed to be bound by the UKAD Anti-Doping Rules and to submit to the authority of UK Anti-Doping in the application and enforcement of the Anti-Doping Rules. Please note UKAD rule 5.7: The consent of a parent or guardian to Testing of the Minor pursuant to these rules shall be inferred from the fact that the Minor has been permitted by their parent or guardian to participate in the sport. 12. Equipment - Red or partially red gumshields are not permitted. It is permissible for personal headguards to be used in the Regional rounds of providing they are from an approved manufacturer as per the current England Boxing rule book. England Boxing will provide STING headguards if any boxer does not have one available at the later stages of the tournament. When gloves are provided by England Boxing at later stages of tournaments their use is mandatory. Boxers are reminded that they are representing their clubs/regions therefore National representative vests should not be worn.

13. Computer Scoring - The electronic scoring computer should be used in all rounds of the championships from regional finals onwards.

14. Declaration of Non-Pregnancy - Female entrants to the Championships are required to make sure a completed England Boxing Seasonal Declaration of Non-Pregnancy ([Female Declaration - Over 18](#) / [Female Declaration - Under 18](#)) has been uploaded onto The Locker, prior to entry. Failure to do so will result in the Boxer being withdrawn from the competition.

15. National Title - If there is no opponent for a Boxer at the national final, the Boxer can only be awarded a national title if they have boxed in an earlier round.
